ORDER

(Granting Request to Withdraw and Motion to Dismiss Contentions 14A and 14B)

I. INTRODUCTION

On June 20, 2014, the Oglala Sioux Tribe, one of the intervenors in this proceeding, voluntarily withdrew two of its contentions - Contentions 14A and 14B.¹ The Oglala Sioux Tribe did not submit any testimony or exhibits on Contentions 14A and 14B. On June 30, 2014, Powertech, the applicant, filed a motion to dismiss Contention 14A and Contention 14B.² No timely answers to the Powertech motion to dismiss were received.³

Consolidated Intervenors filed a Response to Powertech Motion to Dismiss Contention 14 on July 14, 2014. No reason for this late filing was given nor did Consolidated Intervenors include a motion requesting their pleading be accepted out of time.

The request to withdraw and motion to dismiss are granted.4

⁴ On July 14, 2014, Consolidated Intervenors (CI), the other admitted intervenor, filed a response to Powertech's motion to dismiss Contention 14 asking "leave of the Board to present the limited evidence proffered by the Cis (sic) in their Opening Testimony and Exhibits." Consolidated Intervenor's Response to Powertech Motion to Dismiss Contention 14 (July 14. 2014) at 1. This request is out of order and is denied. First, the Oglala Sioux Tribe withdrew these contentions on June 20, 2014. Second, CI has not even attempted to adopt either of these contentions pursuant to 10 C.F.R. § 2.309(f)(3). See Houston Lighting & Power Co. (South Texas Project, Units 1 and 2), ALAB-799, 21 NRC 360, 383 (1985) ("An intervenor may ordinarily conduct additional cross-examination and submit proposed factual and legal findings on contentions sponsored by others. But that does not elevate the intervenor's status to that of a co-sponsor of the contentions. Because contentions can be withdrawn . . . a non-sponsoring party assumes at least some risk that the pursuit of its interests may not be wholly within its control."). Third, Cl's opening written testimony (INT-010) on Contention 14 consists of three pages which do not contain a single question and answer in direct testimony, question and answer format. Having granted the Powertech motion to dismiss and the Oglala Sioux Tribe's request to withdraw these two contentions, they are now moot. No evidence or testimony will be accepted on them from CI.
