

16 Other Relevant Data and Information (Item 20)

Powertech notes that pertinent data concerning uranium deposits in the Centennial Project area are bound to exist in other data storage or, even within the RME data acquired from Anadarko that will enhance the understanding of this project. In addition to the data already obtained, there are likely university or government reports that deal with groundwater conditions in the project area. Census data and weather data will also aid in the completion of permitting and licensing.

Powertech will continue to attempt to locate other pertinent project historical data as the Centennial Project progresses. Powertech is not aware of other relevant data, not in its possession, that could detract from the conclusions presented in this report.

SRK is aware that there are some property owners in the immediate location of the Centennial project that are against uranium mining in Colorado, as evidenced by posted signs to that effect in the project area. Social and political opposition to uranium mining and specifically this project may have bearing on the project; however, the extent of that opposition will likely not be fully known until the public hearing portion of the permitting process begins for the proposed Centennial mine development. As of the date of this report, the potential for social-political impacts on the project cannot be adequately addressed by SRK. This report is based on the technical aspects of the project.

All information relating to the Preliminary Assessment, since the study is geared toward project development, are presented in Section 17 (Item 25) of this report (Additional Requirements for Development Properties and Production Properties).
